The Mainstreaming children with Cerebral Palsy workshop 3 was attended by 22 participants ranging from parents, general Education teachers, special Education Teachers, advocates and even therapists.

The training was facilitated by two people- Tobiloba Ajayi of the Let Cerebral Palsy Kids Learn Foundation and Rhoda Odigboh of the Learning Craft.

The Participants left with an understanding of Cerebral palsy and how it may affect learning methods. They learned how to differentiate lessons and assessments in the classroom and even how to request for accommodations and modifications during high stakes testing such as Common Entrance and the West African Senior Secondary Certificate Examination.

A major highlight of the day was the practical session on creating Individualized Education Plans for the children with cerebral Palsy and how it supports inclusion in the classroom. The participants were armed with both knowledge and skill.
