PUBLIC ENLIGHTENMENT

This year, we have continued to use social media as a tool to reach as many people as we can with the Let CP Kids Learn Message. We also used traditional media as we appeared on both TV and radio interviews alongside quite a number of public speaking engagements. All these reached thousands of viewers and helped us reach more people who needed our services-both families and schools. In March, we ran a 31 day awareness campaign online where we shared one Cerebral palsy fact every day for the month of March.

Our Social Media Reach averaged over 2000 people monthly across our platforms

PHYSICAL AND SCHOOL READINESS ASSESSMENTS

We Provided Assessments to 101 people aged between 7 months old and 34 years.

There are a total of 68 Males and 33 Females

REFERRALS

All 101 clients received referrals as deemed necessary based on the assessment outcomes.

TEACHER TRAINING

We trained 150+ teachers across 10 training programmes within the course of the year



2019 IMPACT ACROSS OUR THEMATIC AREAS

SCHOOL INCLUSION SUPPORT AND SCHOOL PLACEMENT SUPPORT

.We continue to provide Inclusion Support for 4 schools in Lagos State, We added 1 School in Osun State and 1 in Oyo State. .

We were also able to facilitate school placement for 27 children- 17 Males, 10 Females across 4 States in Nigeria.



2019 IMPACT ACROSS OUR THEMATIC AREAS

ANNUAL SYMPOSIUM

The organization hosted its 3rd Annual symposium in March 2019. The theme of the event was 'Achieving Inclusive Mainstream education: The Support Staff Conundrum'.

The goal of the symposium was to bring together parents and teachers and members of the concerned public to discuss the challenges faced in the implementation of Inclusive education for children with Cerebral Palsy.

The event had about 45 people in attendance, made of parents, teachers, educators and members of the public.

It was a good platform for parents and schools to talk to each other and to ensure that the challenges of providing adequate support for children with Cerebral Palsy in mainstream classrooms are mitigated.



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ADDITIONAL ACTIVITIES

SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME FOR CP PARENTS

In collaboration with the Initiative For National Growth Africa, we piloted the Small Business development Programme for parents raising children with Cerebral Palsy themed Empowered Parent thriving child.

The programme was aimed at equipping the select parents with the required Small Business Development and Management Skills such as bookkeeping, Market research, Marketing, Personal budgeting, Digital Marketing and savings for Investment

The parents also learned how to pitch their businesses to attract seed grants,

The pilot had 10 parents and 10 children in attendance. While the parents were learning, the children were being engaged in painting and jigsaw maths activities.

The organization earned a total of 2,961,286,57

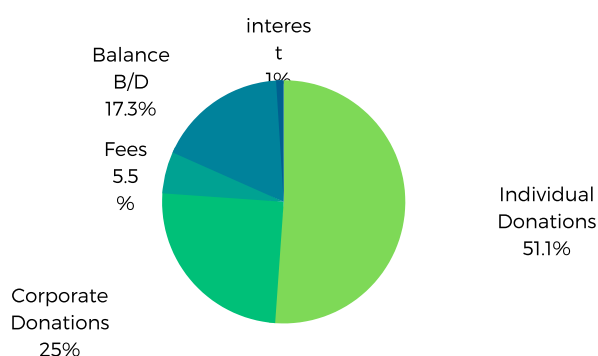
51.8% of Income was from Individual Donors

The organization Spent a total of 1,385,668.47 in 2019

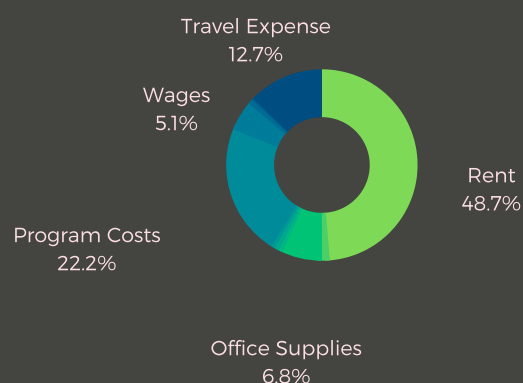
48.7% of Expenditure went to Rent
