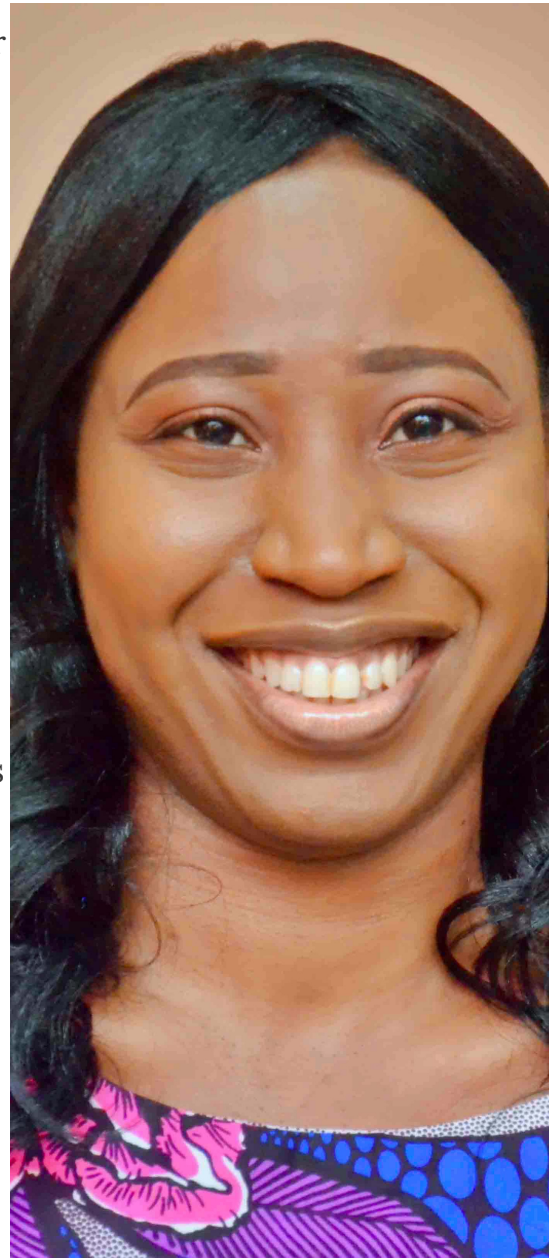
FROM THE CHIEF RESPONSIBILITY OFFICER

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Public Enlightenment

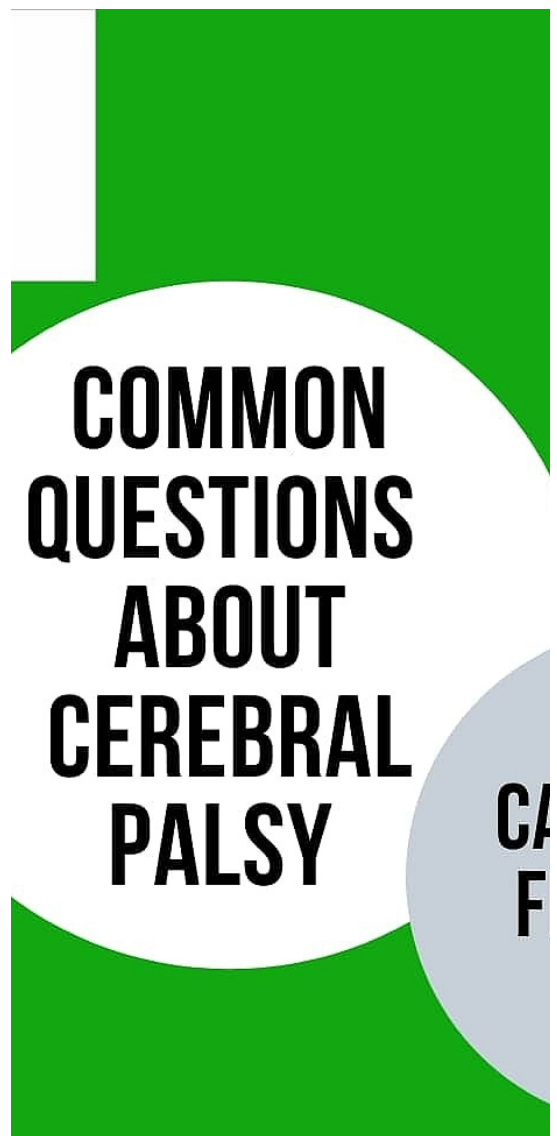
This year, Social Media was the biggest tool we used to reach people with our message due to the peculiarities in the year- and it worked.

We were able to reach a minimum of 3000 people every month with our social media posts and newsletters.

We reached more people needing our services- parents, schools and practitioners.

In March, we ran our month long Cerebral Palsy Awareness Month campaign in Celebration of our adopted Cerebral Palsy Awareness Month

In response to the difficulties caused by the pandemic, Our Chief Responsibility published a Home based therapy guide for parents to ensure that children continued to receive the therapy they need at home.



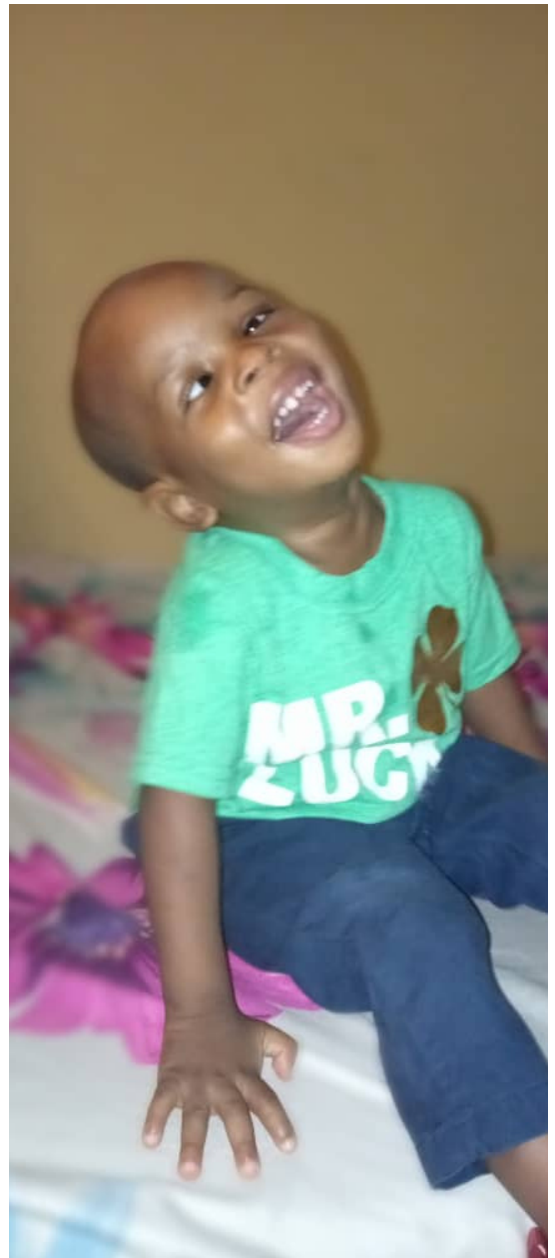
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IMPACT REPORT ACROSS OUR THEMATIC AREAS

Physical And School Readiness Assessments

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We provided physical and/or School Readiness Assessments to 115 people in 2020. Their ages ranged from 1 year to 32 years old . There were 67 Males and 48 Females.

Referrals

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All 115 Families were referred to the required service providers based on the outcome of their assessments.

Teacher Training

We trained 20 teachers in 1 training session during the course of the year

Empowered Parent Thriving Child, Cohort 2

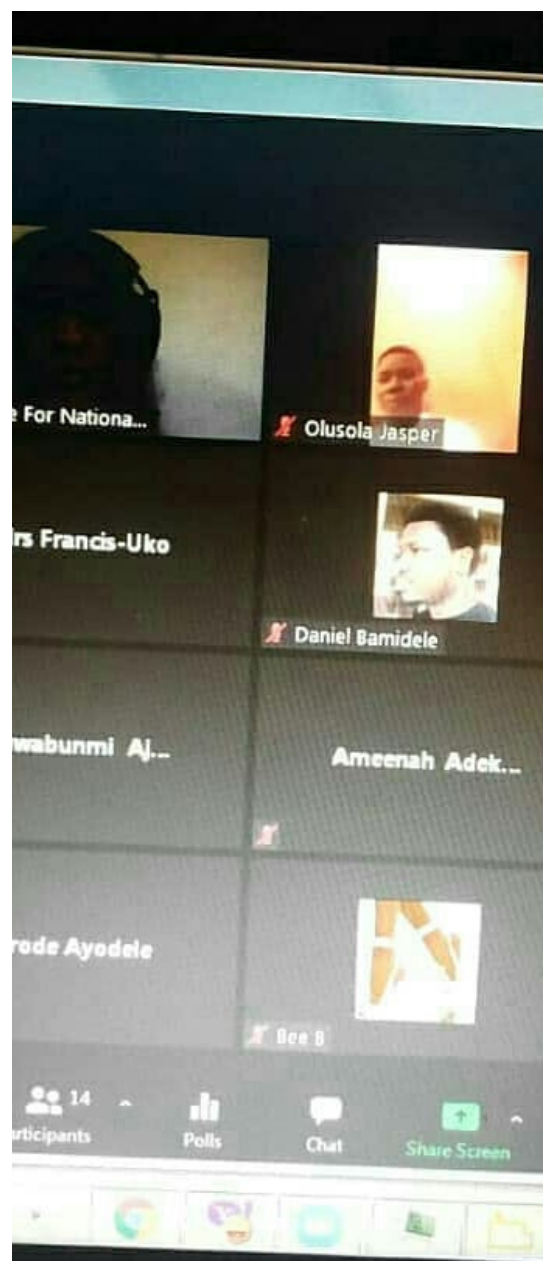
In collaboration with the Initiative for National Growth Africa, we were able to host the 2nd Cohort of the Empowered Parent Thriving Child parent empowerment program for mothers raising children with Cerebral Palsy.

The parents were equipped with Small Business Development Skills such as Book Keeping, Customer Service, Digital Marketing, Personal Finance and Savings for Investments.

The participants also learned how to pitch their business to attract grants and investments.

Each participant received a small business grant to help them grow their existing businesses.

10 Mothers and their children participated in this year's cohort.

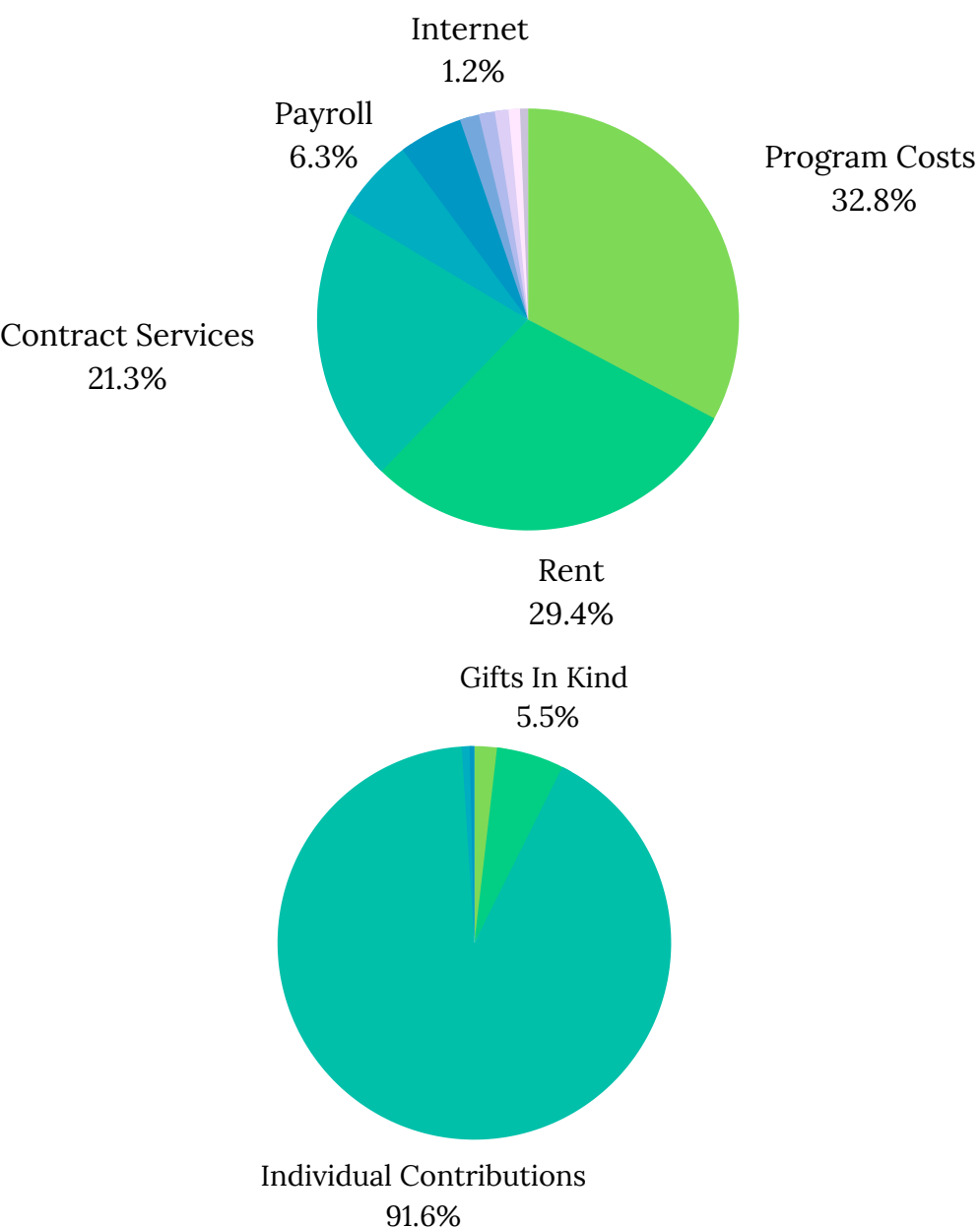
Wins And Losses

In the course of the year, Our Chief Responsibility Officer won the Nigerian Prize on Diversity and Difference which came with a cash prize to support the work of the organization.

Unfortunately, we lost 2 our clients, both male- one died in his sleep, while the other died after a brief illness.



INCOME AND EXPENDITURE SUMMARY



EXPENDITURE CHART

The Organization spent a total of **N1,426,528.53** in the course of the year.

32.8% went to programs

29.4% went to rent

21.3% went to contract services such as accounting and audit

6.3% went to payroll

1.2% to internet

15.3% to telephone, printing, office supplies and delivery costs.

INCOME CHART

The organization raised a total of **N2,710,642.09** in the course of the year.

91.6% came from Individual Contributions

5.5% from Gifts in Kind

2.9% came from Corporate Contributions, Program Service Fees and Interests.

The organization ended the year with a positive cashflow to the tune of **N1,284,113.56**
