GUEST SPEAKERS


MRS ENIOLA SHAKIRAH OLAJOBI

Ms. Eniola Shakirah Olajobi spoke on the topic "The Inclusive School Mindset". She started by defining what the right Inclusive Mindset is and what it is not. She also went on

to debunk common myths about the barriers of Inclusive Education and showed the participants how they can practice Inclusive Education without breaking a bank.

She went ahead to reiterate the fact that Inclusive Education is a Mindset and it doesn't cost a dime to adopt the mindset. She shared the ground-breaking benefits of Inclusive Education, stories of tremendous results she and other school owners have gotten for both children with and without special needs through practicing Inclusive Education such as improving the creativity and problem solving skills of the children.

She went on to take questions and concerns from the participants about the challenges that seem to be hindering them from practicing Inclusive Education.





GUEST SPEAKERS

MRS MS. OLUREMI JOEL-OGBUELI

Ms. Oluremi Joel-Ogbueli spoke on the topic "The Mindset of a Thriving Parent". She began by showing the participants what the Mindset of a Thriving Parent looks like, she also told success stories of some Parents who adopted the right Inclusive Mindset and the result they got. She gave words of succor and encouragement to the parents, at the same time, charging them to be more and do more.

She also gave the parents some practical ways on how they can thrive on the parenting journey such as taking care of themselves, delegating the tasks that should be delegated and helping their child bring out the gift in them. She reiterated that every human has a gift regardless of any special need and parents should focus on that.

Finally, she took questions and concerns from the participants which eventually turned into a safe space where parents shared their stories.

Our Chief Responsibility Officer gave a closing remark and presented Learning Materials to Parent and School of the year- this is a way the organization recognizes and encourages Parents and Schools who have provided excellent support to families of Children with Cerebral Palsy in the course of the previous year.
