Medication Support Project 2: Final Report

Project Overview

The Medication Support Project 2 funded by Dr. Ajayi aimed to provide essential Life Saving Medication to 10 beneficiaries of The Let Cerebral Palsy Kids Learn Foundation for a duration of 2 Months.

The Project Handover Event was held on Saturday 9th March 2025 and the Project End Date was Wednesday 9th May 2025.

Project Beneficiaries

10 Families raising children with Cerebral Palsy, There were 8 Male and 2 Female Beneficiaries. The primary caregivers present at the handover event were all women - 7 Mothers and 3 Grandmothers. The ages of the children ranged from 3 years old to 14 years old.

The occupations of the caregivers ranged from small scale trading to teaching and Administrative Support provision.

Project Impact - Overall Health

63% rated the health of their children as <u>good</u> **BEFORE** receiving the medication support, the rest rating as poor and fair

87% rated the health of their children as <u>very good</u> **AFTER** receiving the medication while the rest rated as good.

100% of participants noticed improvement in their child's health condition after receiving the medication

Project Impact: Seizure Occurrence

25% of beneficiaries were experiencing daily seizures before the project 25% Weekly and 37.5% rarely

After the receiving the medication: 62.5% were rarely experiencing seizures and 25% never experienced a seizure

Project Impact: Livelyhoods

100% of beneficiaries saw a **decrease** in their household expenses as a result of the medication support, and as a result, were able to allocate the resources to other essential needs such as diapers, food and even the payment of school fees for other children in the

household.

75% of beneficiary caregivers have been able to work more or find employment since receiving

the medication for their children.

100% of beneficiaries report an improvement in family economic situations since receiving the

medication.

Project Impact: Quality Of Life

100% of beneficiaries reported an improved quality of life for their children and improved ability

to perform activities.

Project Impact: Caregivers Mental Health

100% of beneficiary caregivers report an improvement in their mental health as the project

relieved them of a major source of worry for 2 months.

The Let Cerebral Palsy Kids

The Medication Support Project was incredibly successful, improving quality of life for 100% of

the children while also improving caregiver mental health for 100% of the caregivers.

The project also improved family economic situations for 100% of the beneficiaries and enabled

75% of the beneficiary caregivers to find work or improve their productivity.

Most Importantly, the project also reduced the occurrence of seizures for all the beneficiaries.

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
