Medication Support Project: Final Report

Project Overview

The Medication Support Project in Collaboration with The IREDE Foundation aimed to provided essential Life Saving Medication to 10 beneficiaries of The Let Cerebral Palsy Kids Learn Foundation for a duration of 2 Months.

The Project Handover Event was held on Saturday 14th December 2024 and the Project End Date was Friday 14th February 2025.

Project Beneficiaries

10 Families raising children with Cerebral Palsy, There were 8 Male and 2 Female Beneficiaries. The primary caregivers present at the handover event were all women - 8 Mothers and 2 Grandmothers. The ages of the children ranged from 4 years old to 13 years old.

The occupations of the caregivers ranged from small scale trading to teaching and Administrative Support provision.

Project Impact - Overall Health

50% rated the health of their children as <u>good</u> **BEFORE** receiving the medication support, the rest rating as poor and fair the production of children with cerebral palsy

The Let Cerebral Palsy Kids

40% rated the health of their children as <u>Excellent</u> **AFTER** receiving the medication, 40% as Very Good and 20% as good.

100% of participants noticed improvement in their child's health condition after receiving the medication

Project Impact: Seizure Occurrence

40% of beneficiaries were experiencing daily seizures before the project 20 Monthly and 40% rarely

After the receiving the medication: 70% were rarely experiencing seizures and 30% never experienced a seizure

Project Impact: Livelihoods

80% of beneficiaries saw a decrease in their household expenses as a result of the medication

support, and as a result, were able to allocate the resources to other essential needs such as diapers, food and even the payment of school fees for other children in the household

50% of beneficiary caregivers have been able to work more or find employment since receiving

the medication for their children.

80% of beneficiaries report an improvement in family economic situations since receiving the

medication.

Project Impact: Quality Of Life

100% of beneficiaries reported an improved quality of life for their children and improved ability

to perform activities

Project Impact: Caregivers Mental Health

100% of beneficiary caregivers report an improvement in their mental health as the project

relieved them of a major source of worry for 2 months.

Conclusion

The Medication Support Project was incredibly successful, improving quality of life for 100% of

the children while also improving caregiver mental health for 100% of the caregivers.

The project also improved family economic situations for 80% of the beneficiaries and enabled

50% of the beneficiary caregivers to find work or improve their productivity.

Most importantly, the project also reduced the occurrence of seizures for all the beneficiaries.

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
