As the world continues to grapple with inflation and its effects, this year stretched us in an unprecedented manner as the number of families requiring multiple layers of supports and services from the organization surged exponentially.

This year we solidified our programs and services offerings and increased our programming to include the Aqua/ Swim Therapy Summer Programme in collaboration with SwininIDay.

This was in a bid to explore additional therapy options to improve motor function for our children with Cerebral Palsy.

The pilot was incredibly successful, with 100% of all participants reporting improved motor function in varying degrees.

This year has expanded the territories of our work into areas that we could not have seen coming this time last year.

While it's had its ups and downs, we can definitely say that this year has brought us closer to our vision of a Nigeria where Inclusive Education is a right and not a privilege.

IMPACT REPORT ACROSS OUR THEMATIC AREAS

PUBLIC ENLIGHTENMENT

Public enlightenment continued to be one of our strongest tools of reshaping public perception about Cerebral Palsy and promoting inclusive mainstream education across Nigeria.

In 2025, we further expanded our virtual advocacy reach by strengthening partnerships and adapting content to suit diverse audience.

Throughout the year, our social

media platforms remained central to our enlightenment efforts. We consistently reached a minimum monthly audience of over 11,000 people, leveraging simple, relatable content to demystify Cerebral Palsy, educate caregivers, and advocate for inclusion.

These virtual enlightenment efforts helped bridge geographic and financial barriers for families seeking foundational knowledge about managing Cerebral Palsy and navigating the educational systems.



IMPACT REPORT ACROSS OUR THEMATIC AREAS

COUNSELLING AND REFERRALS



In 2025, we reached a total of 232 children living with Cerebral Palsy directly. There were 128 males and 104 females.

The ages ranged from 1 year to 20 years old and came from across 12 states of the Federation.

All 232 families were provided referrals to the appropriate school, medical and para-medical services and schools dependent on their needs.

We also provided counselling to some of these families based on their specific needs. The most recurrent concerns of parents and caregivers was General Management Options.

This year, there was a sharp uptake in the number of parents requesting emergency medication support for essential medications and in the number of parents requiring support with Tuition fees,

IMPACT REPORT ACROSS OUR THEMATIC AREAS

TEACHER'S TRAINING

We trained a total of 52 teachers representing over 6 schools this year over 3 different training programs -80% of which were teachers from low-income private schools charging \$50 or less per year.



SCHOOL INCLUSION AND SCHOLARSHIPS



The Foundation was able to place 14 children on 33 tuition scholarship in 16 mainstream schools in 5 states the course of the year.

EMPOWERED MOTHERS, THRIVING CHILD 7



In the collaboration with The Initiative for Growth Africa, we hosted the 7th edition of the small Business Development Program where we empowered mothers raising children with Cerebral Palsy with small grants and skills to grow their businesses.

The mothers were equipped with small Business Development Skills such as Bookkeeping, Customer Acquisition and Retention, Pricing, Savings, and Investment, Branding amongst other valuable skills

While the mothers were learning our facilitators engaged their children with Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math's (STEM) Skills using puzzle blocks, pop circle sticks amongst others. The objective of this was to improve their functionalities, creativity, and problem solving skills in fun ways.

A total of 10 mothers, 10 children with Cerebral Palsy, in this year`s edition of the EPTC program

ANNUAL SYMPOSIUM



Our 9th Annual Symposium held on the 22nd of March 2025. We hosted a total of 42 participants, and we had 2 facilitators. The theme of the event was 'Achieving Inclusive Mainstream Education - Maintaining Emotional Well-being'.

The focus of the discussion is about exploring the role that emotional health and wellbeing plays in the learning process of children with cerebral palsy. The symposium is designed to be a meeting place for both parents and Educators to discuss and curate immediately actionable solutions to the particular challenge mitigating against inclusive education.

We had two guest speakers speak to participants. Mrs Mabel and Mrs Olajobi .

IMPACT REPORT ACROSS OUR THEMATIC AREAS

BUILDING RESILIENT AND INFORMED TEENAGERS WITH CEREBRAL PALSY



The project was designed to give teenagers with cerebral palsy access to the information that they need to stay safe and resilient as they grow into adolescents and young adults. The project provides the selected Teenagers and their caregivers with knowledge and information on topics like: Sexual Reproductive Health, Mental Health, Career Planning, Self Awareness, and Self Advocacy.

There were two separate learning centers -one for the Parents and the other, for the Teenagers. There were 8 sessions facilitated by 5 speakers.

There was total of 19 Participants: 10 Teenagers, 9 Parent/Caregiver, and 7 Volunteers.

IMPACT REPORT ACROSS OUR THEMATIC AREAS

MEDICATION AND THERAPY SUPPORT



This year we hosted 2 rounds of Medication Support Project for children living with cerebral palsy. The project provided 16 families with a 2 months' supply of prescribed medication thereby reducing the burden of the cost on the caregivers.

18 counts of therapy and medication support was provided to 10 children in 2025

SWIM/AQUA THERAPY

In collaboration with Swinin1day, we piloted Swim/Aqua therapy for children with Cerebral Palsy. A total of 7 children were selected across 2 therapy locations in Lagos. The children were sponsored to attend 8 Sessions in 4 weeks, with 100% of them showing Motor Skills improvements at the end of the 4 weeks.



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IMPACT REPORT ACROSS OUR THEMATIC AREAS

PARENT MENTORING PROGRAM



The Parent Mentoring Program launched in 2024 and has continued to be beneficial to parents/caregivers of children living with cerebral palsy.

The sessions run for 6 weeks. 1 hour every week with sessions covering topics on: Understanding and Accepting the diagnosis, Navigating Education and Vocation, Puberty and Adolescents, Redefining Independence, Cerebral Palsy Management amongst others.

150 selected participants along 5 cohorts, 59 invited participants, 31 certified participants.

EMERGENCY CASH TRANSFERS



240 Emergency Cash transfers were provided to over 200 families to meet emergency, medical, nutrition or therapy needs by our generous donors, in the course of the year 2025.

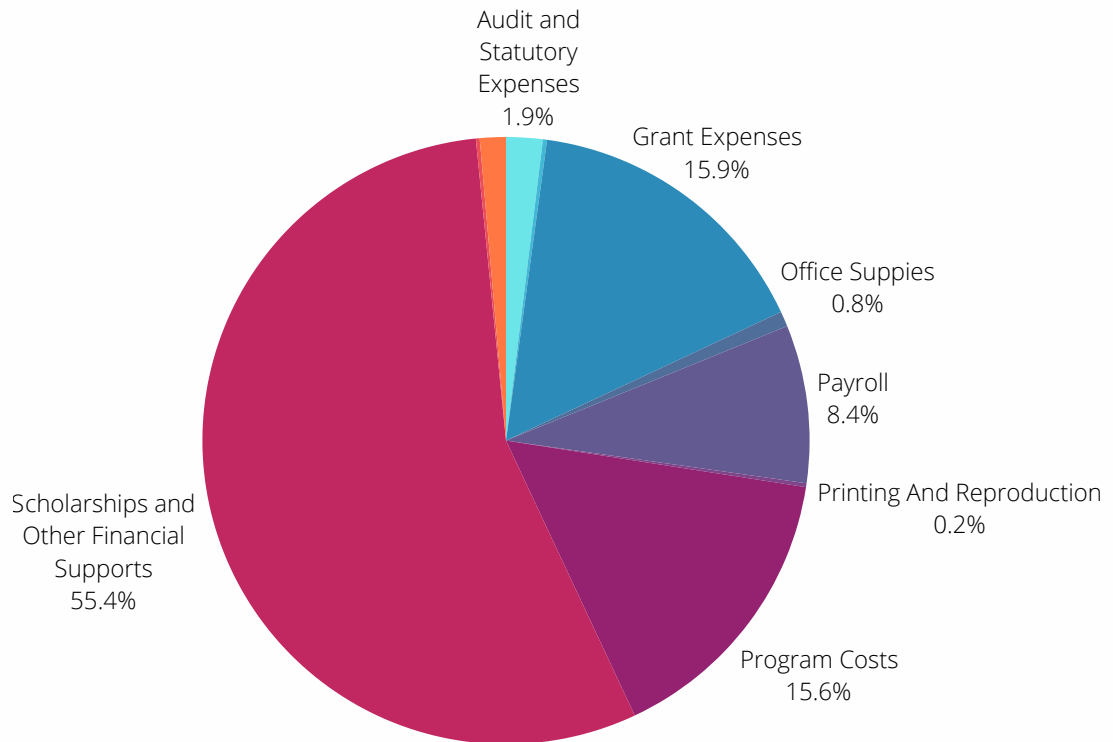
- We were able to newly pilot the Swim/Aqua Therapy for children living with cerebral palsy.

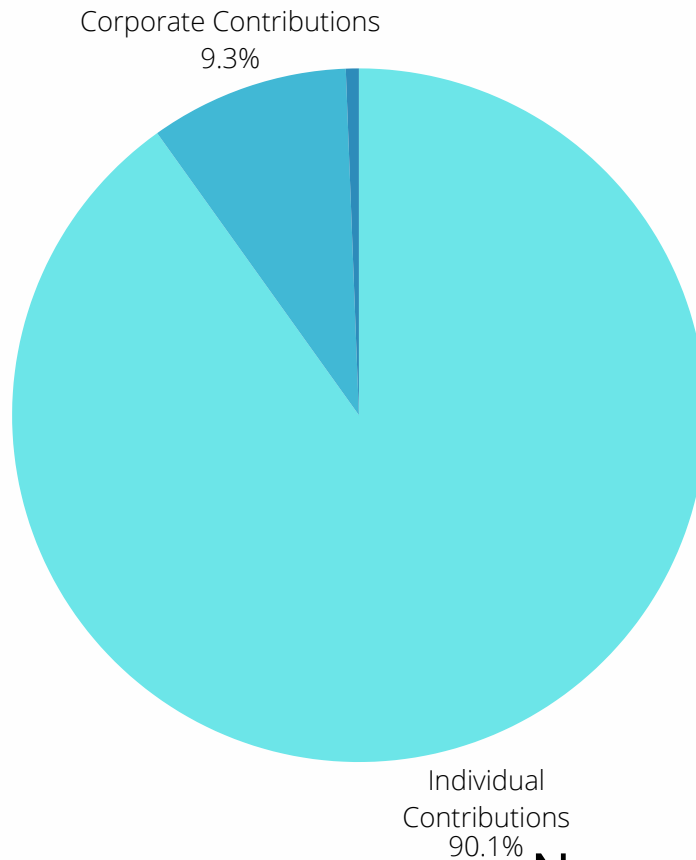
